Class suggestion boxes

Each class brought along their suggestion boxes and we discussed some of the suggestions they contained. As the boxes are only newly established, there were only a handful of ideas to work through. Matters raised will be taken to the next meeting and will be agenda items.

The return of the snack bar

The children were all very keen to get the snack bar back up and running during break times. There was an agreement that it is good for the school (i.e., us being a 'healthy school') and councillors said that they would be happy to help with its organisation and delivery. We discussed the items that could possibly be sold; raisins, rice cakes, smoothies etc and possibly every so often more of a treat – i.e., biscuits, milkshakes. It was shared that it is best to have items that have a long shelf life and do not need to always be kept in a fridge due to storage issues. We discussed how there could be a trolley that is taken out onto the playground.

Action: Mr. McClay will raise the matter with Mrs. McEvoy and Mrs. Webb who are the school's Healthy Schools Leads.

Clubs, playground/OPAL activities

Everyone felt that the offer of clubs at the school is good. There are many free club places such as Fun Football and Choir, as well as paid for clubs such as karate and tennis. There is the free Breakfast Club and the paid for Extended Schools Club used by those working parents and carers who need the childcare. Ideas were shared about other club ideas. These ideas will be put out to staff to see if anyone might have the capacity to run a new club.

There was a lot of enthusiasm around OPAL and its continued journey.

Action: We will revisit OPAL at the next meeting when Ms. Taylor-Brown will be in attendance.
