Anti-Bullying Week – Homework Project



We would like you to take part in our homework project so that we can make a fabulous anti-bullying display showing that Friars children do not accept bullying....ever!

First think how you can help people to 'reach out' to stop bullying. Think about the key points in our child-friendly 'anti-bullying' policy and use some of the ideas below.



For your homework, you can choose from any of the activities below

- **Out of the ordinary** Design a pair of brilliantly bright and colourful odd socks to celebrate Odd Socks Day
- **Super special** Design a super hero who has amazing powers to stop bullying what special powers could he/she have?
- **Terrific T-shirts** Design an anti-bullying T-shirt giving a clear message that we will not accept bullying
- Lovely Letters Write a letter to somebody who is being bullied and you think needs a friend to reach out to them. Think about what you would say to make them feel better, and what advice you might give them.
- **Perfect Poems** Write a poem inspired by the theme 'Reach Out'. It could be a narrative or rhyming poem, a haiku, a riddle, a shape or an acrostic poem.
- **Super Safe School** Design a 'Reach Out School'! Create the perfect school and/or school playground, where all pupils are helped to feel happy, safe and able to report bullying or anything they are worried about. Think about:
- ✓ Different spaces e.g. open spaces, quiet areas
- ✓ Fun equipment which is accessible to all
- ✓ What the school facilities would look like to make sure they include everyone
- ✓ Activities that will encourage kindness
- ✓ Things that encourage pupils to look out for others
- ✓ Things to help people make friends and ensure everyone is included

Then draw a labelled floor plan of the school and/or playground (pupils could even create a diorama).

• Handy Hands - Draw around your hands and forearms onto paper, and then fill the space inside with their own artistic design. We want them all to look unique and very different and we will then make them into a big communal circle of hands 'reaching out'.

Bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or online.

Together we can stop bullying!
